Studying Salvation – Part 4 – Faith and Works

Introduction

- 1. Russian Missionary Illustration \rightarrow we need to understand what faith is
- 2. Thiessen Quote: "What then is faith? It is not easy to formulate a simple and adequate definition."
- 3. If we don't know what faith is, we can't have it and thus can't be saved.

The Definition of Faith

- 1. The English words "faith" and "belief" are from the same Greek word (pistis)
- 2. Like love, what matters about faith is the object
- 3. Belief is simple (not heart faith vs. head faith), like other kinds of belief.
- 4. Reasons faith is normal belief
 - a. The New Testament evangelists just use the word believe without modifiers
 - b. The New Testament evangelists only warn of unbelief, not the wrong kind of belief
 - c. Faith is synonymous with "being fully convinced," (Rom. 4:21), "receive a testimony (1 John 5:9), and being persuaded (Acts 28:24)
- 5. No difference between believing a person and believing a fact
 - a. Sometimes it's believe in (i.e. John 3:16), sometimes believe that (Jn. 11:27, 20:31, I Jn. 5:1)
 - b. Jury duty illustration

The Sufficiency of Faith

- 1. 150 times faith is the only requirement given. (i.e. Acts 16:31)
- 2. Everyone who believes is saved (i.e. John 3:16, 6:25-40)
- 3. Christ's work on the cross is sufficient (Gal. 2:19)
- 4. We are specifically told "not by works" (i.e. Rom. 3:21-29, Rom. 4:3-5, Eph. 2:8, 9, Titus 3:5)

The Definition of Works

- 1. Works are outward, take energy, are done by a person. Belief is internal and passive.
- 2. Both good works and bad works are still works
- 3. Illustrations of works → volunteering, communion, baptism, walking an aisle, raising your hand, repeating a prayer
- 4. Scripture prohibits us from many ANY work a requirement for eternal life, including the ones above
